DETERMINATION

Under the authority vested in me by the Commission, I issue the following determination as to the merits of the above cited charge.

Respondents are employers within the meaning of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (Title VII). Timeliness and all other requirements for coverage have been met.

Charging Party alleged that she and a class of female employees were subjected egregious verbal and physical harassment of a sexual nature when the owner, Dr. Juan Ortega including asking her out, making inappropriate sexual comments, groping her breast mocking gestures, grabbing her, and forcibly trying to kiss her. Charging Party further alleged she reported the sexual harassment to the Office Managers and the owner's son, who is also a physician. However, no action was taken to stop the harassment. Charging Party further alleged that on May 6, 2016, she was forced to resign from her employment due to the continued sexual harassment.

The Commission's investigation obtained witness testimony to support the Charging Party's allegations. I have considered all the evidence obtained during the investigation and find that there is reasonable cause to believe that there is a violation of Title VII in that the Charging Party and at least one other similarly situated employee was sexually harassed and subjected to a hostile work environment because of their gender.

I have considered all the evidence obtained during the investigation and find that there is reasonable cause to believe that there is a violation of Title VII in that Respondents engaged in unwelcome verbal and physical conduct of a sexual nature.


This determination is final. Upon finding that there is reason to believe that violations have occurred, the Commission attempts to eliminate the alleged unlawful practices by informal methods of conciliation. Therefore, the Commission now invites the parties to join with it in

reaching a just resolution of this matter. The confidentiality provisions of Title VII and Commission regulations apply to information obtained during conciliation.

If the Respondents decline to discuss settlement or when, for any other reason, a settlement acceptable to the office Director is not obtained, the Director will inform the parties and advise them of the court enforcement alternatives available to aggrieved persons and the Commission. A Commission representative will contact each party in the near future to begin conciliation.

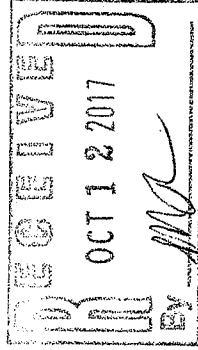
