Your operation, B&C Advance Learning Center located at 10860 JONES RD, HOUSTON, TX 77065-4218, was recently investigated because of a report concerning a possible deficiency of the minimum standard rules or another law.

Specifically, the report states the following that led to this investigation:

It is alleged that inappropriate supervision contributed to a child becoming unresponsive while in care.

The Child Care Licensing Division of the Health and Human Services Commission (CCL) has evaluated applicable administrative rules, minimum standard rules, and other laws and made the following findings:

	<p>746.1201(1) Responsibilities of Employees and Caregivers -Demonstrate Competency, Good Judgment, Self-control</p>	<p>Based on the information obtained, the caregivers did not demonstrate good judgment or competency when caring for children. A three month old child was placed on their stomach to sleep instead of on their back. The infant was not developmentally able to roll over and was found unresponsive as a result of the sleeping position. Staff had completed the required Sudden Infant Death training and yet still placed the child in an incorrect sleeping position.</p> <p>Staff also were not truthful to Licensing staff about the infant's sleeping position which resulted in the child becoming unresponsive.</p>	<p>Y</p>	<p>07/31/2018</p>	<p>N</p>
